SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information

Remove contaminated, saturated clothing immediately.

After inhalation

Provide fresh air. Move victim to fresh air. Put victim at rest and keep warm.

After contact with skin

After contact with skin, wash immediately with polyethylene glycol, followed by plenty of water. Take off immediately all contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse. If skin irritation occurs: Get medical
